Product Description

Detection Method:SandwichTest principle:This assay employs a two-site sandwich ELISA to quantitate DDN in samples. An antibody specific for DDN has been pre-coated onto a microplate. Standards and samples are pipetted into the wells and anyDDN present is bound by the immobilized antibody. After removing any unbound substances, a biotin-conjugated antibody specific for DDN is added to the wells. After washing, Streptavidin conjugated Horseradish Peroxidase (HRP) is added to the wells. Following a wash to remove any unbound avidin-enzyme reagent, a substrate solution is added to the wells and color develops in proportion to the amount of DDN bound in the initial step. The color development is stopped and the intensity of the color is measured.
