## **Product Description**

Detection Method:Competitive ELISATest principle:This assay employs the competitive enzyme immunoassay technique. The microtiter plate provided in this kit has been pre-coated with an antibody specific to ACVR-Ab-IgG. Standards or samples are then added to the appropriate microtiter plate wells with a Horseradish Peroxidase (HRP)-conjugated ACVR-Ab-IgG and incubated. The competitive inhibition reaction is launched between with HRP labeled ACVR-Ab-IgG and unlabeled ACVR-Ab-IgG with the antibody. A substrate solution is added to the wells and the color develops in opposite to the amount of ACVR-Ab-IgG in the sample. The color development is stopped and the intensity of the color is measured.
